As of 2021, pre-primary education will be compulsory for 5-year-old children. 6-year-old children are obliged to attend primary school, preferably according to the place of residence.

Secondary and vocational schools are under the jurisdiction of the regional government. Students can choose between a general academic secondary education at a "gymnasium" or a specialized secondary education at a school with enhanced coverage of certain subjects and skills.














This leaflet contains basic information and some important responsibilities of the Municipality Office of Banská Bystrica.

Geography & Demographics

Banská Bystrica is a city in central Slovakia, the capital of the Banská Bystrica Region and the Banská Bystrica District. It is the seat of many institutions. It is located on the banks of the Hron river and encircled by the mountain chains of the Low Tatras, the Veľká Fatra, and the Kremnica Mountains. As a historical city with easy access to the surrounding mountains, Banská Bystrica is a popular winter and summer tourist destination.

With 76 089 inhabitants, Banská Bystrica is the sixth most populous municipality in Slovakia. 2 830 foreigners from EU and third countries live in the Banská Bystrica Region (June 2020).

The city of Banská Bystrica has its own representative bodies - the mayor and city council - as well as advisory bodies of councils and committees.

The Municipality Office consists of departments dealing with various life situations e.g. education, social care, regional development, culture and sport, local taxes etc.

Local Taxes and Fees

The municipality has its own local taxes and fees which have to be paid also by foreigners, e.g. property tax, tax for accommodation, dog tax, tax for using public spaces, and fees for municipal waste.



Municipality Participation

Anyone who holds temporary or permanent residence including foreigners on the territory of the city has the right to participate in the municipality. You can participate in municipality meetings, and address your suggestions or petitions to the mayor, the city council and advisory bodies of the municipality.

Only residents of a city (persons with permanent residence) have voting rights. Foreigners with permanent residence have the right to vote for and to be elected as mayor/governor and city/regional council, and vote in local/regional referendum.

Social Services

If you find yourself in a difficult life or social situation, you can contact or visit the Client Centre, which provides basic social counselling, helps clients to understand the complex system of social care and recommends appropriate solutions for your situation.

The Municipality Office of Banská Bystrica provides social care and services including care homes, housing facilities for people in need, domestic violence shelters, emergency shelters, facilities of supported housing, a social service centre and community centre.

The Municipality also cooperates with other providers of social care, charitable organisations and civic associations.

Health Care

A register of health care providers operating in the city and region is issued by the Office of the Banská Bystrica Self-governing Region. Every person with health insurance is entitled to receive necessary healthcare.

The main responsibilities of the Municipal Police are the prevention of crime, protection of health and property, solving crisis situations between neighbours, etc. SOS Emergency Calls 112 is for state police, fire, ambulance (also in English)

Education & Schools

As of 2021, school attendance will be compulsory for children of 5 to 16 years of age. You can find high quality primary, secondary, and vocational schools established by the state, churches or private entities. The City of Banská Bystrica has established 29 nursery schools, 11 primary schools and one centre for leisure activities.
